THE SUPERNATURAL CLAIMS OF THE BIBLE

A. The Bible claims that God has revealed Himself throughout history in a variety of ways. For instance:

• Numbers 12:6-8: He said,

"Hear now My words:

If there is a prophet among you,

I, the LORD, shall make Myself known to him in a vision.

I shall speak with him in a dream.



Not so, with My servant Moses, He is faithful in all My household; With him I speak mouth to mouth ..."

• Deuteronomy 18:18:


"I will raise up a prophet from among their countrymen like you, and I will put My words in his mouth, and he shall speak to them all that I command him."

• Ezekiel 1:1:

Now it came about in the thirtieth year, on the fifth day of the fourth month, while I was by the river Chebar among the exiles, the heavens were opened and I saw visions of God.

• Luke 2:25-26:

And there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon; and this man was righteous and devout, looking for the consolation of Israel; and the Holy Spirit was upon him. And it had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Christ.







• Revelation 1:1:

The Revelation of Jesus Christ, which God gave Him to show to His bond-servants, the things which must soon take place; and He sent and communicated it by His angel to His bond-servant John ...

• Hebrews 1:1-2:

God, after He spoke long ago to the fathers in the prophets in many portions and in many ways, in these last days has spoken to us in His Son, whom He appointed heir of all things, through whom also He made the world.

B. The Bible's "grand claim" is that it is a book of supernatural communication, inspired by God in its entirety!

• 2 Timothy 3:16-17:

All Scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in righteousness; so that the man of God may be adequate, equipped for every good work.

• 2 Peter 1:20-21:

But know this first of all, that no prophecy of Scripture is a matter of one's own interpretation, for no prophecy was ever made by an act of human will, but men moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God.

A. Prophetic evidence

• Micah 5:2 -- 700 B.C.

"But as for you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, Too little to be among the clans of Judah, From you One will go forth for Me to be ruler in Israel. His goings forth are from long ago, From the days of eternity."

• Isaiah 9:6-7 -- 740 B.C.

For a child will be born to us, a son will be given to us;

And the government will rest on His shoulders;

And His name will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God,

Eternal Father, Prince of Peace.

There will be no end to the increase of His government or of peace,

On the throne of David and over his kingdom,

To establish it and to uphold it with justice and righteousness

From then on and forevermore.

The zeal of the Lord of hosts will accomplish this.

B. Personal, experiential evidence

• 1 Thessalonians 2:13:

For this reason we also constantly thank God that when you received the word of God which you heard from us, you accepted *it* not *as* the word of



men, but *for* what it really is, the word of God, which also performs its work in you who believe."

• John 8:31-32:

So Jesus was saying to those Jews who had believed Him, "If you continue in My word, then you are truly disciples of Mine; and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free."

Which yields its fruit in its season



From start to finish, the Bible's main character is Jesus -- history's greatest person -- and its main theme is connecting man to God. So how does Jesus and connecting man to God come together? And how does that apply to each of us? Few questions could be more important than these two.

02 WHAT HOLDS US BACK FROM AN ABUNDANT LIFE WITH JESUS?

The human race has always been a mystery. We are at the same time a blend of noble brilliance and tragic foolishness. The Bible acknowledges our conflicted nature using Paul's words (one of Jesus' followers) in **Romans 7:15:**


"For what I am doing, I do not understand; for I am not practicing what I *would* like to *do*, but I am doing the very thing I hate."

We've all been there, haven't we? Probably many times!

We've all had moments where we were unwilling to do what we knew was right while giving in to things we knew were clearly wrong and would ultimately regret.

The Bible diagnoses this persistent problem within each of us with a single word:

So, what is sin? It's easy to assume sin is lawless pleasures (drunkenness, sexual immorality, pornography, gluttony, etc.) or hurtful behaviors (murder, rage, theft, lying, cheating, adultery, etc.). But sin as defined by the Bible is actually much deeper than these evil actions.





1. How does Isaiah 53:6 define sin?

All of us like sheep have gone astray,

Each of us has turned to his own way ...

Sin is ... Going my _____ in life without God.

- 2. How many people sin like this?
 - Isaiah 53:6 (see above in question 1)
 - Romans 3:23: ... for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God ...

So, sin at its root is not simply about bad habits and vile behaviors. Those things are merely the outward fruit of sin. Sin at its root is about a universal, inward reality within each of us: we want our way, not God and His way.

03 WHAT SIN LEADS TO IN OUR LIVES

According to **Romans 6:23**, what does sin bring to a person's life? For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.





Sin brings _____.

So, what kind of death is being referred to in **Romans 6:23**? Again, let's let the Bible define that answer for us in Genesis 2 and 3 where sin first entered our world through Adam and Eve. Here is where you will find what the Bible means by death.

1. Genesis 2:16-17:

¹⁶ The LORD God commanded the man, saying, "From any tree of the garden you may eat freely; ¹⁷ but from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat from it you will surely die."

What specifically was God's revealed will to Adam in Genesis 2:16-17?

What would be the consequence for disobeying this command in Genesis 2:17?

When would this consequence take effect according to verse 17?

Now the BIG question. Did Adam and Eve die the moment they ate? It's important that we find out.

One thing is for sure. As we read on in Genesis 3, the "death" God promised for this sin was more than just the physical loss of life. So in Genesis 3, let's observe what kind of death actually came about after Adam and Eve sinned.

2. Genesis 3:7-13:

⁷ Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they knew that they were naked; and they sewed fig leaves together and made themselves loin coverings. ⁸ They heard the sound of the LORD God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God among the trees of the garden. ⁹ Then the LORD God called to the man, and said to him, "Where are you?" ¹⁰ He said, "I heard the sound of You in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; so I hid myself." ¹¹ And He said, "Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten from the tree of which I commanded you not to eat?" ¹² The man said, "The woman whom You gave to *be* with me, she gave me from the tree, and I ate." ¹³ Then the LORD God said to the woman, "What is this you have done?" And the woman said, "The serpent deceived me, and I ate."

What kind of death did the first couple suffer in their relationship with God in Genesis 3:8?



What kind of death was suffered in this couple's feelings of security in verse 9-10?

What kind of death undercut their openness and transparency in verses 7-8?

What kind of death broke out in their relationship with each other in verses 11-13?

What kind of death infected their clear consciences in verses 7-11?







3. Genesis 3:16-19:

¹⁶ To the woman He said,

"I will greatly multiply

Your pain in childbirth,

In pain you will bring forth children;

Yet your desire will be for your husband,

And he will rule over you."

¹⁷ Then to Adam He said, "Because you have listened to the voice of your wife,

and have eaten from the tree about which I commanded you, saying, 'You shall not eat from it';

Cursed is the ground because of you;

In toil you will eat of it

All the days of your life.

¹⁸ Both thorns and thistles it shall grow for you;

And you will eat the plants of the field;

¹⁹ By the sweat of your face

You will eat bread,

Till you return to the ground,

Because from it you were taken;

For you are dust,

And to dust you shall return."

What kind of death would play out in the future for this couple in verses 16-17?



What kind of death would bring their lives to an end according to verse 19?

So Genesis 2 and 3 tell us that the death promised by God "in the day" Adam and Eve sinned would not be one thing, but a variety of things including physical death. These sadly are the same deaths that afflict our lives as men and women when we sin today.

04 HOW JESUS HELPS US

Rather than leaving us alone in our sin and death, Jesus entered history offering us a better way if we would turn and believe in Him. Remember His words in **John 10:10**, "I have come that you may have life, and have it abundantly."

To bring this life to us, Jesus did two things:

1. He died for our sins.

Sin, as God promised in Genesis, always brings death with it. This is to show us how serious our sin is to God. But with Jesus' help we can escape this punishment. It's NOT that this punishment has been set aside. It's that Jesus





stepped in and suffered this penalty for us (on the cross, Jesus suffered all the "deaths" sin brings, not just physical death) by willingly dying in our place.

• Romans 5:8:

"But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us."


By dying for us, Jesus offers us deliverance from the death we deserve as sinners. By believing in Him, we are forgiven and set free rather than punished for our sins.

2. Through His resurrection, He connects us to God for a better life.

By rising from the dead, Jesus brings us into a relationship with God so we can experience the abundant life. This is a life we could have never obtained on our own by trying harder to live better. We have it because Jesus has joined us to God.

• 2 Corinthians 5:17-18:

(As you read verse 18, substitute "connected" for "reconciled.")







Therefore if anyone is in Christ, *he* is a new creature; the old things passed away; behold, new things have come. Now all *these* things are from God, who reconciled (i.e., connected) us to Himself through Christ ...

This new life and connection with God goes on ever after our physical death.

• John 11:25:

Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life; he who believes in Me will live even if he dies ..."

05 SO HOW DO WE RESPOND TO JESUS' OFFER OF A BETTER LIFE?

The Bible says over and over, we need to believe in Jesus.

• John 3:16:

"For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life."







- 1 John 5:11-13: And the testimony is this, that God has given us eternal life, and this life is in His Son. He who has the Son has the life; he who does not have the Son of God does not have the life. These things I have written to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, so that you may know that you have eternal life.
- John 10:10: "I came that they may have life, and have *it* abundantly."
- John 14:1-3: "Do not let your heart be troubled; believe in God, believe also in Me. In My Father's house are many dwelling places; if it were not so, I would have told you; for I go to prepare a place for you. If I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and receive you to Myself, that where I am, *there* you may be also."
- 1 Corinthians 3:10-15: According to the grace of God which was given to me, like a wise master builder I laid a foundation, and another is building on it. But each man must be careful how he builds on it. For no man can lay a





foundation other than the one which is laid, which is Jesus Christ. Now if any man builds on the foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, straw, each man's work will become evident; for the day will show it because it is to be revealed with fire, and the fire itself will test the quality of each man's work. If any man's work which he has built on it remains, he will receive a reward. If any man's work is burned up, he will suffer loss; but he himself will be saved, yet so as through fire.
