

This raises three questions:

Consider what Paul says later in **Ephesians 5:28-29:**

“In the same way husbands should love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. For no one ever hated his own flesh...”

- Paul rightly assumes that men will look out for their best interests. We intuitively know this and see this all around us.
- Though it's natural and often appropriate to act in our self-interest, the gospel teaches us that Christ is our model;

Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her...

- King Jesus "*gave himself up*" for his bride, the church. He is our standard regarding acting in the best interests of another.
- Jesus did not mince words when he commanded us to love and declared what it looked like:

John 15:13-14:

"This is my commandment, that you love one another as **I have loved you**. Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends."



Active listening is making a conscious effort to hear, understand, and retain the information being relayed to you. It is a deep understanding of what you hear as you pick up on the speaker's intent, content, and emotion. Active listening requires paying attention. If you're watching NetFlix or scrolling through TikTok on your phone while someone is talking, you're not actively listening.

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


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
